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| HIGH-RISK | <p>Carolina Herrin (C127_2018) Pg. 12</p> | <p>Restructures State Central Committee (SCC) by implementing term limits. [Requires 2/3 Vote]</p> | VOTE NO |
| | <p>Karece Thompson (C126_2018) Pg. 13</p> | <p>Massive restructure of the SCC. Gives the Chair the power to remove 54% of SCC Members. [Requires 2/3 Vote]</p> | VOTE NO |
| | <p>Diane Christensen (Not Received by C&B) Pg. 15</p> | <p>Massive SCC restructure / 37% of SCC permanently removed & gives 20 people the ability to remove another 58 SCC members. [Requires 2/3 Vote]</p> | VOTE NO |
| HIGH-RISK | <p>Clair Ellis (C118_2018) Pg. 17</p> | <p>Expands proxy voting in State Central Committee Meetings. Allows for manipulation of outcomes at SCC meetings by unelected people. [Requires 2/3 Vote]</p> | VOTE NO |
| | <p>Clair Ellis (C120_2018) Pg. 18</p> | <p>Requires 50% of SCC to call a meeting, rather than 25%, which is a near impossible threshold. Allows a rogue Chair to shut down party business. [Requires 2/3 Vote]</p> | VOTE NO |
| | <p>Clair Ellis (C121_2018) Pg. 18</p> | <p>Changes threshold from 50% to 75% of SCC members to make agenda changes. 75% is a near impossible threshold and will prevent important party business from being conducted. [Requires 2/3 Vote]</p> | VOTE NO |
| | <p>Clair Ellis (C122_2018) Pg. 18</p> | <p>Increases quorum requirement of SCC from 40 to 72 (40%) - Bad idea because it allows a rogue Chair to cancel special meetings by encouraging non attendance. [Requires 2/3 Vote]</p> | VOTE NO |
| | <p>Clair Ellis (C123_2018) Pg. 18</p> | <p>Increases quorum requirement of SCC from 40 to 72 (40%) - Bad idea because it allows a rogue chair to cancel special meetings by encouraging non attendance. [Requires 2/3 Vote]</p> | VOTE NO |
| | <p>Lowell Nelson (C114_2018) Pg. 19</p> | <p>Prevents important party business from being added to an SCC Meeting agenda at the meeting [Requires 2/3 Vote]</p> | VOTE NO |
| | <p>Dana Goff (C101_2017) Pg. 20</p> | <p>Sponsor not a State delegate - Changes threshold to from 60 to 70% to become GOP noniminee and avoid primary - protects incumbants. [Requires 2/3 Vote]</p> | VOTE NO |
| | <p>Benjamin Thompson (Replaced by Pg. 33)</p> | <p>Aims to make voting at the State Convention more efficient - might be good, but change is highly technical and needs to be researched and debated (with data) before being sent to Convention. [Requires 2/3 Vote]</p> | VOTE NO |
| | <p>Benjamin Thompson (C108_2018) Pg. 30</p> | <p>Gives auxillaries (e.g. College Republicans) and elected Republican officials speaking privileges, but not voting privileges in SCC Meetings. [Requires 2/3 Vote]</p> | VOTE YES |
| <p>Benjamin Thompson (C102_2018) Pg. 33</p> | <p>Clarifies how multiple ballots are counted and candidates are chosen at Convention [Requires 2/3 Vote]</p> | VOTE NO | |

The following proposals were properly vetted by our Party's Constitution & Bylaws Committee.

Removal of an officer by the State Central Committee requires an impossible threshold of 108 votes, while the average attendance is only 111. Please vote yes so to strengthen accountability for our Party Officers.

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| David L. Alvord (C115_2018) Pg. 37 | Allows state delegates who elect an officer to remove an officer. Changes threshold for SCC to remove an officer to 2/3 of a meeting (where 2/3 of SCC members are present) [Requires 2/3 Vote] | VOTE YES |
| Bob McEntee (C116_2018) Pg. 38 | Changes the removal process for any Party officer from 60% to ¾ of a majority of the voting members of the SCC. [Requires 2/3 Vote] | VOTE YES |

There's value in providing a way for State Delegates to ensure their amendment proposals are heard at the Convention. However, if passed in its current form, delegates will experience an unlimited amount of proposals. (Needs to be amended, which is not allowed at Convention.)

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| Dave Duncan (C113_2018) Pg. 35 (B111_2018) Pg. 35 | All C&B amendment proposals must be submitted by 6 State Delegates and should go straight to convention without review by the C&B Committee (requires a change to both the Constitution & Bylaws) [Requires 2/3 Vote] | NEUTRAL |
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The next two proposals are competing. Thompson's gives full authority to the County to choose voting methods. Nelson's requires counties to allow preferential voting & multiple ballots. County Parties should have control over their processes.

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| Benjamin Thompson (C101_2018) Pg. 21 | Allows counties to use any voting method so long as it's approved by their County governing documents (similar to C112_2018 from Lowell Nelson) [Requires Majority Vote] | VOTE YES |
| Lowell Nelson (C112_2018) Pg. 34 | Allows counties to use whatever method they want, but expressly sanctions 2 existing methods (almost same as C101_2018 - Benjamin Thompson) [Requires 2/3 Vote] | VOTE NO |

The following proposals are commonsensical for keeping the Party accountable and transparent.

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| Clair Ellis (C125_2018) Pg. 17 (C119_2018) Pg. 17 | Requires votes of SCC Members to be recorded and published. [Requires 2/3 Vote] | VOTE YES |
| Kirby Glad (C103_2018) Pg. 23 | Adds a specified process to elect a Chair pro tem in a meeting when the Chair is not present. [Requires Majority Vote] | VOTE YES |
| Kirby Glad (C104_2018) Pg. 24 | A Party Officer cannot run for or hold a Partisan public office at the while he or she is serving as a Party Officer. [Requires Majority Vote] | VOTE YES |
| Kirby Glad (C105_2018) Pg. 25 | Clarifies that agenda items can be added only to regular SCC meetings by a majority vote. [Requires Majority Vote] | VOTE YES |
| Kirby Glad (C106_2018) Pg. 26 | Clarifies duties of the Chair. Gives power to the Executive Committee to hire and fire Party staff. [Requires Majority Vote] | VOTE YES |
| Kirby Glad (C107_2018) Pg. 27 | Fixes/clarifies technical errors in language to prevent overlaps or lapses in leadership in the Party. Grants duties and powers to Vice Chair, Secretary, & Treasurer. [Requires Majority Vote] | VOTE YES |
| Lisa Shepherd (C124_2018) Pg. 29 | Adds a simple title to Article XII. [Requires 2/3 Vote] | VOTE YES |
| Benjamin Thompson (C110_2018) Pg. 32 | Requires State Executive Committee Meetings to be held monthly. [Requires 2/3 Vote] | VOTE YES |
